

# Foggy Dew

This song of the Easter rising of 1916 was an appeal for Irishmen to die fighting for their own country rather than die in some foreign war in a British uniform. Suvla was a battleground in the Middle East. "Pearse" and "Valera," mentioned in the third stanza, refer to Patrick Pearse, leader of the Easter rising, and Eamon de Valera, who later became prime minister of Ireland.
